### JOHN ALL

Welcome to the University of Georgia, Center for Continuing Education for our 71st meeting of the Georgia Entomological Society. We have a program of relative topics in entomology for the many professional entomologists, students, and others interested in insects in Georgia. On Wednesday afternoon we will have our traditional Bug Run and Golf Tournament. The meeting Thursday will start with the Founder's Lecture honoring Dr. Jerry Payne and presented by Dr. Ted Cottrell. In his tenure with the USDA Southeastern Fruit and Tree Fruit Laboratory during 1969 through 1994, Dr. Payne was known for his energy and enthusiasm in many diverse entomological and biological activities and was active in numerous organizations including GES. We are honoring two Fellows of GES this year, Dr. Jim Dutcher and Dr. Keith Griffith. Both have been stalwart supporters and contributors to our society for many years. The special topics symposium centers on invasive pests. Following our industry panel, we will have a wide variety of entomological topics presented in oral papers and posters including the student competition. The luncheon will also include a slideshow with the photo contest submissions for this year, and the student awards for 2007 will be presented at the evening reception.

John All is a Professor of Entomology in Athens. He created and has taught the courses in Insect Pest Management (ENTO 3740), Integrated Pest Management (ENTO (CRSS/PATH) 4740/6740), and Pesticides and Transgenic Crops (ENTO (CRSS/PATH) 4250/6250) for many years and is the graduate coordinator of the Master of Plant Protection and Pest Management (MPPPM) Program. He has been major advisor of 11 Ph.D., 14 M.S. and 23 MPPPM students and served on the advisory committee of 111 graduate students. He has 418 publications from an IPM research program.



### GEORGIA ENTOMOLOGICAL SOCIETY 2007 FOUNDER HONOREE



**JERRY A. PAYNE** 

Jerry A. Payne was born in the Blue Ridge Mountains of northern Virginia approximately 70 years ago. He attended local public schools before earning degrees from Virginia Polytechnic Institute, University of Tennessee and Clemson University. His early academic pursuits were in the areas of premedicine, mammalogy, speleology, forensic entomology, radiation ecology, radioactive waste disposal and wildlife biology.

Jerry served as a research entomologist at the USDA Southeastern Fruit and Tree Nut Research Laboratory in Byron, GA, from 1969 to 1994, studying the biology and management of the mite and insect pests of blueberries, peaches, plums, nectarines, pecans, and Chinese chestnuts in the southeastern United States. Jerry also researched the production, entomology, and nutrient value of apples, Allegheny chinkapins, deerberries, mayhaws, pawpaws, Oriental persimmons, Asian pears, sparkleberries, hardy passion fruit and flowering quince. For a 5 year stint in his career, he served as an apple breeder, releasing 'Early Thompson' and 'Hardy Cumberland' jointly with the University of Tennessee. In addition, he has served on collection teams for strawberry, hickory, pecan, blueberry, pawpaw, and walnut germplasm from the United States, Mexico, China, and Vietnam. Jerry was a wildlife biologist in the Non-Game Endangered Wildlife Program for the Georgia Department of Natural Resources from 1994 to 1997. Jerry published over 320 papers and abstracts and he made over 175 research presentations at field days, workshops, technical conferences, seminars, and scientific meetings, 90 of which were by invitation.

Jerry conducts and/or participates in 8 North American Butterfly Association 4th of July Butterfly Counts in Georgia. He and wife Rose document butterfly occurrence in 15 central Georgia counties for "The Georgia Butterflies" web site. Jerry has a beetle, 2 millipedes, a protozoan, an isopod and a spider named in his honor.

### GEORGIA ENTOMOLOGICAL SOCIETY 2007 FOUNDERS' LECTURER



**TED COTTRELL** 

Ted Cottrell grew up on a farm located near the Mammoth Cave region of Kentucky. There he gained valuable experience regarding the economic realities of production agriculture as related to burley tobacco and beef cattle. This background served to start his career path as a Research Entomologist with the USDA Agricultural Research Service. Ted received a B.S. in Biology from the University of Kentucky in 1990, a M.S. in Entomology from Auburn University in 1994, and a Ph.D. in Entomology from the University of Kentucky in 1998. He joined the USDA-ARS SE Fruit and Tree Nut Research Laboratory at Byron, GA in 1998.

Dr. Cottrell's current assignment is to conduct entomological research on pecan and peach. His research with pest species has included the bionomics and biological control of both the pecan weevil and plum curculio, landscape distribution of Euschistus spp. stink bugs, alternative management strategies for pecan aphids and both mating disruption and biological control for management of sesiid borers attacking peach. His work with natural enemies continues to examine the interaction of the exotic multicolored Asian lady beetle with native coccinellids, differential susceptibility of native and exotic coccinellids to entomopathogens and methods to increase natural enemy abundance in orchard settings.

Dr. Cottrell collaborates widely with fellow researchers and their projects have been funded through competitive grants including the Pest Management Alternatives Program (PMAP), Risk Avoidance and Mitigation Program (RAMP), EPA – Strategic Agriculture Initiative, Sustainable Agriculture and Research Education (SARE), SE Pecan Growers Association and the Georgia Agricultural Commodity Commission for both peach and pecan. His publications include 25 peer-reviewed research articles along with a number of abstracts, proceedings and trade journal articles.

### 2007 FELLOWS OF THE GEORGIA ENTOMOLOGICAL SOCIETY

Two members of the Society are recognized as Fellows of the Georgia Entomological Society at this meeting, Dr. James Dutcher and Dr. Keith Griffith. Such recognition is reserved for individuals who have made significant contributions in entomological teaching, research, extension, or administration.



### **JAMES DUTCHER**

I became interested in agriculture in 1971 as a senior in college while working as a student assistant in a lab that measured sublethal effects of herbicides on crop plants and effects of herbicides on algae growth in rivers near farms. After graduation, I went to work as a research assistant with Dr. Howitt along with three other graduate students on fruit crops. We worked on insect and mite problems of all the different fruit crops grown along the Lake Michigan coastline from apples near Kalamazoo to grapes in Pentwater to cherries near Traverse City. I

was finishing up my paper and coursework and Dr. Howitt advised that I go to UGA to work with Dr. All. A research assistantship was posted in the Entomology Department Office to work on grape root borers and I went to UGA in 1975 and worked for three summers on grape root borer biology and control in vineyards in northern Georgia. Dr. All had several graduate students and we had a great time working together on different projects in insect pest management on corn and grapes. I began working with Georgia pecan growers in 1978 at the Coastal Plain Experiment Station and I do a series of field experiments each season to test the efficacy of insecticides and biological control agents. Over several seasons, these experiments have resulted in some fairly effective control methods that are used across Georgia. Georgia pecan growers now have at least one and usually several effective controls for all major insect and mite pests that occur in Georgia. Initial problems with insecticide resistance, resurgence and replacement have been quelled by new pest management schemes that have reduced the frequency of insecticide sprays or replaced broad spectrum sprays with either selective insecticides and miticides or biological controls. In recent years I have begun to work on small fruit crops in southern Georgia. Gerard Krewer and I have developed a chemical control for Pierce's Disease on bunch grapes and controls for ground pearls on blueberries. I have also developed effective biological control systems for pecan aphids and pecan mites by combining predator releases and intercrops.

### **KEITH GRIFFITH**



Keith Griffith received his B.S. degree in Biology (Entomology Major) in 1972 and M.S. degree in Entomology (minor in Plant Pathology) from Clemson University in 1974. He began his career in 1974 as an assistant county extension agent (Clemson Univ.) in Colleton County, SC and then moved to Florence, SC in 1976 as an IPM Extension Entomologist – Clemson University on cotton and other row crops. He was responsible for training and supervising cotton scouts in the Pee Dee Region and extension insect control recommendations for tobacco. In the fall of 1977, Keith joined Pennwalt Corporation as a Technical Service / R&D Representative covering 7 southeastern

states. In 1981, he joined Thompson Hayward Chemical Co. (T-H) as Technical / R&D representative for Alabama and the Florida panhandle. In 1982, (T-H) was purchased by Uniroyal Chemical Company. Keith transferred to Orlando, Florida in 1983, and has been with the Uniroval Chemical Company organization (currently called Chemtura Corporation) for 25 years as Technical Sales Service / R & D representative till the present time working various state territories in the southeast. He has helped develop and label uses for various insecticides/ acaricides (Dimilin, Micromite, Comite, Omite, Acramite, Diamond, and Rimon) in the US as well as herbicides, fungicides, and plant growth regulators. Keith has presented, authored, and co-authored a number of technical papers at various meetings over the years, and he received the 2001 Technical Achievement Award for Crop Protection Division – Crompton Corporation (now Chemtura). During his career, he has been a long time member of the Entomological Society of America, Southeastern Branch - ESA, the Florida Entomological Society (FES), the Georgia Entomological Society (GES), the South Carolina Entomological Society, and other agricultural related organizations. He has served on a number of ESA- SE Branch committees over the years, most recently SEB nominating committee chairman (2007). He has actively served on various FES and GES committees over the years. In 1994-95, he was honored to serve as President of the Georgia Entomological Society at the Albany, GA meeting.
