#### Minutes of the 2012 Annual Meeting of the Georgia Entomological Society

# Executive Committee Meeting Minutes April 4, 2012. Holiday Inn, Statesboro, GA

Attending: David Riley (President), Alan Harvey (President-elect), Alton Sparks (Secretary-Treasurer), Beverly Sparks (2013 Site Selection), Nancy Hinkle (Historian)

Program Committee Report and Local Arrangements (Alan Harvey) — The program was completed. One hundred copies were printed. Several changes in the program occurred after printing including cancellation of one talk and movement of three talks to adjust for the available time. A few changes were also required in judges for presentations. Program and Judging changes are attached. We did have an issue with breakfast being included in the Program while the Society did not fund the breakfast.

Nominations Committee Report (David Riley) – Gerald Harrison and Larry Newsom agreed to their nominations as President-Elect. Paul Smith was nominated unopposed as Secretary/Treasurer. Elections will be held at the Awards Luncheon. Both elections will be opened for nominations from the floor prior to conducting the voting.

Financial Report (Stormy Sparks) – The financial report for 2011 was presented (attached). One member of the audit committee had reviewed the books and financial report and had offered his approval; the second member was scheduled to review the books during the meeting. Stormy did make the suggestion that the future Secretary/Treasurer have checks printed with a "void after" statement as a few checks were not cashed until well over 6 months after being issued, which causes problems in maintaining accurate books.

Journal of Entomological Science Annual Report (Wayne Gardner was not able to attend but submitted the attached report).

Journal Issues – David Riley reported that Wayne Gardner had submitted his resignation as Editor of the Journal after approximately 20 years in this position. David presented a proposed new editing structure for the Journal with proposed changes in the guidelines (attached) to coincide with the proposed changes. The proposed changes and proposed changes in payment for services were discussed. It was decided that the proposed changes should be presented at the Final Business Meeting for discussion by the Society. Changes include the addition of two Associate Editors. Stipends for the Editor and Business Manager will also be proposed to be increased.

Site Selection (Beverly Sparks) – Both Unicoi State Park and Amicalola Falls State Park were investigated as potential sites for the 2013 Annual Meeting. It was reported that Unicoi may well be under renovation at that time and that Amicalola was suggested as the most likely site. If the dates can be set within the next few weeks it was indicated we could lock in rates for the meeting. Current rates range from \$80-105 for a double room and \$115 for a king. They also have cabins with 4 beds for \$95-105. The meeting space and facilities were discussed and appear to be adequate to meet our needs.

#### **Final Business Meeting Minutes**

#### April 6, 2012, Holiday Inn, Statesboro, GA

Dr. David Buntin was recognized as a Fellow of the Georgia Entomological Society and was presented with a plaque as such.

### Journal of Entomological Science:

The proposed change in the structure of the editorial board was presented by David Riley. After discussion it was agreed that in addition to the current Business manager and Editor, two Associate Editors would be added. David Buntin has agreed to serve as Editor of the Journal when Wayne Gardner steps down and will work with Wayne in the next year to learn the process of producing the Journal. Associate Editors will be John All and Xinzhi Ni. The exact functioning and interactions of these positions will be established with the cooperation of Wayne Gardner and David Buntin.

NOTE: Communications after the annual meeting resulted in Xinzhi Ni being replaced by Kerry Oliver. Thus, the Journal organization after the 2013 annual meeting will consist of the Editor (David Buntin), Business Manager (Susan Thornhill), Associate Editor for applied manuscripts (John All), and Associate Editor for basic manuscripts (Kerry Oliver).

The honorariums for these positions were discussed, proposed and voted as follows: the Editor will receive \$1500 annually and the Business Manager \$1000 annual from the Society. The Associate Editors will receive \$500 annually from the Journal. The Journal paying for the Associate Editors will require approval of the current Editor.

It was proposed that the increased honoraria for the Editor and Business Manager be made retroactive to 2011 to recognize their contributions to the Journal and Society. This was moved by Nancy Hinkle, seconded by Tracie Jenkins and passed unanimously by voice vote.

Final issues with the Journal involved discussion of the potential and cost of on-line availability (which will be further investigated, but has been reported to be cost prohibitive) and the potential need for legal protection of the Journal's name.

Site Selection (David Riley for Beverly Sparks) – David presented a brief PowerPoint on Amicalola Falls provided by Beverly. After discussion it was moved (by Nancy Hinkle) that we meet at Amicalola Falls on April 10-12, 2013. Seconded by Alan Harvey and passed unanimously by voice vote.

Reading of the 2011 Minutes were waived.

Secretary/Treasurers Report (Stormy Sparks) – The financial report covering activity in 2011 (attached) was distributed and discussed. Nancy Hinkle moved for acceptance of the report, seconded by Will Hudson, passed unanimously by voice vote. Stormy Sparks again suggested that any new checks printed for the Society should contain a "void after" statement to avoid book keeping problems.

Audit Committee (David Buntin) – David Buntin indicated that the audit committee had reviewed the books and found them to be in order. (report attached).

Resolutions (Ann Amis) – the resolutions (attached) were read. Moved to accept by Frank French, seconded by Kris Braman and passed unanimously by voice vote.

Snapp Award – The Snapp Award, for best presentation by a regular member, was presented to Scott Horn.

Awards and Scholarships – a full listing of award winners is attached.

Elections – It was announced that Paul Smith, who ran unopposed, would serve as the new Secretary/Treasurer. In a very close race, Gerald Harrison was elected to the office of President-Elect.

John All (on behalf of Terry All) informed the group of current problems with the GES web page. The web page has been maintained on a computer that is failing. The web page also has some format compliance issues that will come into play if housed on a University computer. It was agreed these issues need to be addressed and a committee will be formed for this purpose.

Insect Survey – Phillip Roberts was asked about the status of the Insect Lost and Cost of Control Survey. Phillip briefly discussed the history of this publication and the current status. This publication is currently several years behind.

Fun Run and Golf Report – Both the Fun Run and Golf events were conducted this year and successfully completed by participants.

Alan Harvey was presented as the 2013 President of GES. Alan presented David Riley a plaque in gratitude for his service as GES President.

Meeting was adjourned.

# 2011 ANNUAL REPORT Submitted 03 April 2012

Volume 46 of the *Journal of Entomological Science* was published in 4 issues which were mailed on 1 February 2011 (issue no. 1), 12 April 2011 (issue no. 2), 11 July 2011 (issue no. 3), and 11 October 2011 (issue no. 4). Cover photos for each of the issues were provided by Lisa Ames (no. 1), George Braman (no. 2), Russell Mizell (no. 3), and Raymond Hix (no. 4). These were selected from among the entries in the 2011 GES Photo Salon.

Volume 46 was published 348 total pages with 31 scientific articles (309 total pages), 10 scientific notes (35 total pages), 3 author guidelines (3 pages), and 1 Notice to Membership (1 page).

During 2011, 53 manuscripts were submitted for publication in the Journal. The acceptance rate was 85%.

For those 41 manuscripts published in volume 46, the average time from receipt of the manuscript to action taken on acceptance was 84 days, and the average time from receipt to actual publication was 251 days (~8 months).

Susan Thornhill, Business Manager for JES, reported a balance \$49,629.66 in the *Journal* account at Regions Bank (Griffin, GA) as of 29 February 2012. Deposits and disbursements for the account were as follows:

## Proposed changes to the Journal of Entomological Science Editorial Guidelines

#### JOURNAL PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE

The Committee oversees the review of articles and publication of the *Journal of Entomological Science*. The Publications Committee consists of the Editor, <u>two</u> Associate Editors. Business Manager and <u>the variousadhoc</u> Subject Editors if needed.

#### EDITOR:

# General Charge of Responsibilities by Georgia Entomological Society Constitution:

<u>Article X. Section 2. – Editor:</u> The *Journal of Entomological Science* shall be edited and published by the Editor. The Editor shall be appointed by the Board of Directors for a 3-year term and may succeed himself. The Editor may appoint an Associate Editor for a 3-year term.

#### **GUIDELINES:**

- 1. The Editor of the *Journal of Entomological Science* shall serve as Chairman of the Publications Committee and Editorial Board, be knowledgeable of the editorial policies of the *Journal of Entomological Science*, work closely with the Associate Editors, Subject Editors and authors in reviewing and selecting manuscripts for publication in the *Journal of Entomological Science*, and comply with all other duties of the position description established by the Board of Directors.
- 2. Appointment of Associate Editors: The Editor will appoint antwo Associate Editors to assist him with the functions of Editor (subject to the approval of the Board of Directors). These Associate Editors may serve successive terms.
- 3. Appointment of Subject Editors: The Editor will determine the need for subject area specialists and appoint appropriate Subject Editors as needed. The Editor will provide guidance and support for these editors, evaluate their performance, and act as arbiter of disputes between Subject Editors and authors.
- 4. The Editor is invited to attend all Board of Directors meetings and is asked to make an annual report on the fiscal status of the *Journal of Entomological Science* including receipts, disbursements and balances of the funds for the Journal.
- 5. Notify subscription companies of rates for each year's *Journal of Entomological Science*. Make corrections to mailing addresses for returned journals and reship to the members, in the next supplementary mail out.

## **EDITORIAL BOARD:**

# General Charge of Responsibilities by Georgia Entomological Society Constitution:

Article X, Section 3. – Editorial Board: The Editor and Associate Editor may enlist the services of Subject Editors where special expertise is needed. Terms will be staggered so that the Editor and Associate Editors are not resigning in the same year. Each year the Editor shall provide the current slate of subject and associate editor names for the Board of Directors approval and recognition for service to the journal. A minimum of two professional reviewers per manuscript is recommended. The Associate Editors will send all manuscripts out for peer review that the Editor assigns them. They will recommend acceptance or rejection to the Editor after peer review and corrections of revisions, but the final decision can only be issued to the author directly from the Editor. Thus, the Associate Editor's relationship with the author(s) is advisement on how to make the manuscript acceptable if the paper is determined to require major or minor revisions. Communication with the authors by the Associate Editors will be limited to "unacceptable as submitted". Dismissal of an Associate or Subject Editor (e.g., poor performance) will be subject to the approval of the GES Board of Directors.

#### Considerations:

Large number of students (33) who do not pay registration, plus relatively well attended meeting (93 total attendees); however, meals and breaks were estimated (and charged) at 70-80 attendees (appears the hotel probably based charges on 70 for lunch, even fewer for breaks). This helped hold down the cost and provided plenty for those in attendance. The hotel appears to have been extremely reasonable on our food costs (example: lunch for 80 was \$766.31 with tax and gratuity included).

The Society spent \$256.80 on the cash bar for the mixer/student award program.

We saved \$500 in scholarship money as we had no applicants for the MS level.

The Society spent approximately \$250 extra on tee-shirt orders because of a mix-up in the order, but should not need tee-shirts in 2013.

The room did cost the Society \$375, which frequently is avoided by guaranteeing a room block in the host hotel (there are pluses and minuses to this issue).
