2019 GEORGIA ENTOMOLOGICAL SOCIETY MEETING



The upcoming meeting will be held **April 10-12, 2019** at the Lake Blackshear Resort and Golf Club in Cordele, GA. A block of rooms is available at https://www.lakeblackshearresort.com/accommodations or 1-800-459-1230 (group #308694). To receive the contracted room rate, contact the Lake Blackshear Resort & Golf Club by **March 11, 2019** (reservation deadline).

Be sure and mention that you are with the *Georgia Entomological Society* to get the meeting rate. Room rates in both the Villa and the Lodge are \$109.00 (plus \$10 resort fee, and taxes) per night. The discounted room rate is also available before and after the conference, if you should choose to extend your stay.

- <u>Note</u>: State employees should bring tax-exempt forms.
- Note: Breakfast will not be provided by GES.

As in the past, the meeting will have a Founders Lecture recognizing the 2019 Founder honoree.

The meeting will also consist of contributed papers and posters from regular members; B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. student paper competitions; student poster competition; announcement of the M.S. and Ph.D. scholarship winners; industry panel session; photo salon competition; fishing tournament; fun run; and silent auction.

The meeting registration fees will be \$150 for regular members, \$75 for Fellows and Emeritus members, and \$25 for spouses. Student registration is \$25. **Registration includes annual dues** (you do NOT have to pay dues separately), journal subscription, awards luncheon, morning and afternoon breaks, the evening mixer, and other meeting benefits (e.g., cash awards, scholarships, plaques).

Submit paper and poster titles by **March 11, 2019**. *Please don't wait until the last minute*. Submit your paper or poster to Nancy Hinkle via email at (NHinkle@uga.edu).

Submitted papers should be 8 minutes long with 2 minutes for discussion. A PC laptop, computer projector, remote control/laser pointer, and wired microphone will be available for oral presentations. Authors must have PowerPoint presentations on a flash drive to load onto the computer prior to the session.

Posters should be **no larger than 36" wide by 48" tall** to fit on the poster boards. Please bring Velcro to adhere your poster to the board. Posters should be easily read from a distance of 6 feet (font >28 point).

Competitions

- Best oral presentation by B.S. student (J.H. Oliver, Jr. Award)
- Best oral presentation by M.S. student (T.L. Bissell Award)
- Best oral presentation by Ph.D. student (C.M. Beckham Award)
- Best student poster submission (U.E. Brady Award)
- Best oral presentation by a regular member (O.I. Snapp Award)

Oral Presentation Judging Criteria

- Organization (20 points)—sequence of topics logical and effective; introduction, body of talk
- Delivery (20 points)—poise, audibility, expression, eye contact, use of pointer
- Visual Aids (20 points)—appropriate for subject matter, legible, visual appeal
- Subject Matter (30 points)—important questions addressed, appropriate methods
- Handling of Questions (10 points)—questions made clear to audience; answers logical and appropriate
- Conforming to time constraints (maximum 8 point penalty)—deduction of 1 point for each 15 seconds over time or each 30 seconds under time limit.

Poster Presentation Judging Criteria

- Organization (30 points)—sequence of topics logical and effective; introduction, body of talk
- Presentation (30 points)—legible, visual appeal, coordination of text and figures
- Subject Matter (30 points)—originality, scientific rigor, difficulty of problem
- Conclusion/Synthesis (10 points)—summary of main points clear and concise, logical, justified

INSECT PHOTO SALON

CATEGORIES: Portrait—close-up photo of a living insect. **Biology**—photo that 'tells a story' of how insects live and/or die. **Sequence**—3-5 photos describing insect biology. **Microscopic**—photo of living insect, non-living insect or insect material.

FORMAT: Preference will be given to photographs with a horizontal format as this format is needed for journal cover consideration. Limit of 2 individual photos per category and one sequence per participant. **DIGITAL IMAGE REQUIREMENTS**: Digital images submitted for cover photos must be saved and submitted as TIFF files or high quality JPEG files. For cover consideration, photos should be at least 1 MB in file size (preferably larger—the more detailed the better), but still feature the insect prominently without an abundance of extraneous background.

Submission of Digital Images: Digital submissions should be submitted to Lisa Ames (lames@uga.edu) or, if too large, send on a CD (see below for CD submission). Each image, whether sent via e-mail or regular mail, should include name of photographer, category, photo title and brief description.

DEADLINE: All entries must be received by Lisa Ames by **March 11, 2019**.

JUDGING: Criteria for judging are excellence in photographic technique, aesthetic appeal, engaging use of subject and scientific accuracy.

Four photos will be chosen from the total pool of photos to appear on the cover of the *Journal of Entomological Science*. Photos need not win a category to be chosen for a cover. For regular mail submissions, please use the following form:
