Scientific/Educational merit (60 points)

Hypothesis or need for research/educational activity clearly stated.	(15 points)
Sound research/education methodology used to prepare project.	(20 points)
Presentation of research/activity adequate for reader to gain understanding.	(10 points)
Results of research/educational activity clearly stated.	(15 points)

Poster Presentation (30 points)

Uses a good combination of text and graphics to explain message (presents one to three mainpoints, etc	(5 points)
Ease of reading text and graphics on poster. (Print or graphics easy to read, easy to interpret, are concise, easy to understand sentences)	(10 points)
Information on poster is balance and organized (Information is not crowded, poster has logical order)	(10 points)
Poster uses colors and contrast to visually attract readers	(5 points)
Follows instructions for presentation	
Title, author names(s) affiliations and addresses appears on poster	(5 points)
