

Minutes of the 2011 Annual Meeting of the Georgia Entomological Society

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes

April 6, 2011. Lake Blackshear Resort and Gold Club, Cordele, GA

Attending: Ted Cottrell (President), David Riley (President-elect), James Hadden (Past-President), David Buntin, Alton Sparks (Secretary-Treasurer)

Program Committee Report (Riley) – The program was completed with minor problems. One oral presentation has been changed to a poster. (NOTE: two or three posters not in the program were presented at the meeting.

Local Arrangements – Dr. Toews was in charge of local arrangements. He was not able to attend the Executive Committee but it was reported that all arrangements for the meeting had been made in conjunction with staff at the Lake Blackshear Resort and Golf Club.

Financial Report (Sparks) – The issue of the discrepancy that occurred in the books and annual meeting reports was discussed (this issue is included in the 2010 annual meeting minutes). This appeared to result from a mistake in reporting in which the 2008 financial report was copied into the 2009 minutes without adjusting the numbers. A full report is attached with the 2011 Annual Meeting Minutes.

Journal of Entomological Science Annual Report (Wayne Gardner was not able to attend, report presented by David Buntin) – full report is attached. One significant recent change in the Journal is the availability of pdf reprints.

Awards and Recognition (Cottrell) – Keith Griffith will be honored as a Founder of GES, with the Founder Lecture to be presented by Lance Peterson. Fellows of the Society for 2011 are Beverly Sparks and Robert McPherson.

GES Scholarship Committee (Hadden) – Cheri Abraham (PhD) and Nick Keiser (MS) won the GES Student Scholarships.

Nominations Committee (Hadden) – Alan Harvey and Xinzhi Ni have been placed on the ballot for President-elect. The vote will take place during the Awards Luncheon.

Final Business Meeting Minutes

April 8, 2011, Lake Blackshear Resort and Golf Club, Cordele, GA

Reading of the 2010 Minutes were waived. Secretary-Treasurer Sparks did report on the findings on the issue of the account discrepancies reported in 2010. His report to the GES Governing Board is attached and will be amended to the 2010 minutes. The 2010 minutes with the proposed amendment were accepted.

Fun Run and Golf Report – David Buntin reported for Jon All that there were 8 runners. Drs. Braman and Horton won with a time of 13 minutes and 8 seconds. There were no golfers in the 2011 Annual Meeting golf outing.

Insect Survey – Phillip Roberts reported the need to update the Control Costs and Losses Reports. Currently this report is about two years behind.

Student Affairs – Michael Toews reported on the presentation competitions. There were 6 papers in the MS oral presentation competition, 3 papers in the PHD oral presentation competition, and 3 in the student poster competition. There were 17 presentations in the Snapp paper competition (regular member competition). Winners of all competitions are listed in the attached awards report. Judges are acknowledged in the attached Student Affairs Committee report.

Journal of Entomological Science Annual Report – presented by David Buntin for Wayne Gardner – full report is attached.

Audit Report – the audit committee comprised of David Buntin and Michael Toews reported that they had reviewed the report on the apparent discrepancy and the books for 2010 and found the GES financial books are accurate and in order as of December 31, 2010. Full report is attached. The report was accepted by voice vote.

Resolutions Committee – resolutions for the 2011 Annual Meeting (attached) were presented by William Tietjen. The resolutions were accepted by voice vote.

Site Selection for 2012 – Alan Harvey reported on the site selection for the 2012 Annual Meeting. Two sites were being considered: on or near the SGU campus in Statesboro and the Coastal Georgia Center (affiliated with SGU) in Savannah. Both sites were discussed and presented for vote. Statesboro was selected with 15 votes to 10 for Savannah. It was moved that the 2012 meeting be held in Statesboro and this motion passed via voice vote with a single dissenting vote. Dates for the meeting were discussed and proposed as April 4-6, 2012. These dates were accepted via voice vote.

Financial Report – the 2010 financial report was presented by secretary-treasurer Sparks (Report attached). The report was accepted via voice vote.

Snapp Award – there were 17 oral presentation by regular members that were judged for the Snapp Award. The winner was Tracie Jenkins.

Elections – John Ruberson reported that Alan Harvey had been elected as President-Elect of GES for 2012.

New business – It was indicated that the Japanese publish a Journal of Entomological Science. Further discussion suggested the title may not be exactly as ours, but very similar (may just be Entomological Science). The question was raised as to whether our journal title is trademarked. It was decided that Wayne Gardner should be made aware of this issue and determine future steps.

Ted Cottrell indicated that Auburn University wanted to place a web page link on the GES web page. Discussion issued on the pros and cons. No decision was made.

David Riley was presented as the 2012 President of GES. David presented Ted Cottrell a plaque in gratitude for his service as GES President.

Meeting was adjourned.

While not presented during the business meeting, a list of all award winners and a financial summary of the 2010 annual meeting are attached for GES records.

JOURNAL OF ENTOMOLOGICAL SCIENCE

2010 ANNUAL REPORT

Submitted 04 April 2011

Volume 45 of the *Journal of Entomological Science* was published in 4 issues which were mailed on 8 February 2010 (issue no. 1), 24 May 2010 (issue no. 2), 12 July 2010 (issue no. 3), and 11 October 2010 (issue no. 4). Cover photos for each of the issues were provided by Daniel R. Suiter (no. 1), Jeffrey Brushwein (nos. 2 & 3), and Lisa Ames (no. 4). These were selected from among the entries in the 2010 GES/SCES Photo Salon.

Volume 45 was published 402 total pages with 33 scientific articles (352 total pages), 12 scientific notes (40 total pages), 1 author index (2 pages), 1 subject index (2 pages), and 3 author guidelines (3 pages).

During 2010, 47 manuscripts were submitted for publication in the Journal. The acceptance rate was 87%. To date, only 2 of the 47 manuscripts have not been accepted and remain with the authors for revisions.

For those 45 manuscripts published in volume 45, the average time from receipt of the manuscript to action taken on acceptance was 107 days, and the average time from receipt to actual publication was 326 days (11 months).

Susan Thornhill, Business Manager for JES, reported a balance \$51,416.61 in the *Journal* account at Regions Bank (Griffin, GA) as of 28 February 2011. Deposits and disbursements for the account were as follows:

Report to GES Governing Board and Audit Committee

RE: Account discrepancies

Problem:

The 2009 GES Annual Report indicated a balance of \$76,732.23 on February 28, 2009.

On September 17, 2009, \$67,740.80 was transferred to the new secretary-treasurer.

Expenditures between February and September of 2009 do not explain the loss of funds.

Explanation:

It was first discovered that the 2009 and 2008 Annual Report contained identical numbers. It was assumed that the 2008 report was pasted into the 2009 report without adjusting the numbers. To investigate this, the checking account statements for 2007, 2008 and 2009 were examined (monthly balances attached). While the values of our CDs are not included, when transferred in 2009, they were worth \$69,130.46. The checking balance on April 1 of 2008 was likely in excess of \$9,000 (March statement indicates \$9,276.32). Thus, our April 1 balance in 2008 would have been near the value reported for both years. It is very likely that the balance indicated for both 2008 and 2009 is from 2008. In addition, this balance is somewhat artificially inflated as it occurred just prior to the Annual Meeting at Lake Blackshear (the March 2008 balance is much higher than months prior and after). This balance includes donations for the meeting and does not include expenses, which were relatively high for our Society (\$7,270.66 paid for food, beverages, etc., plus awards).

The 2009 balance in February shows the balance of \$70,592.15 after transfer of two CDs. Certificate of Deposit Receipts were obtained showing values of \$38,738.53 on 2 February and \$30,391.93 on 12 February, 2009. Annual Meeting and other expenses reduced the balance to \$66,803.42 in June (the last bank statement in the files prior to transfer of funds). A closing statement for the checking account was obtained, showing a final withdrawal of \$67,740.80. The equivalent amount was transferred to the new secretary-treasurer on September 17, 2009.

The fact that the discrepancies occurred appears to be the result of error in cutting and pasting from one annual report to the next. The fact that the discrepancy was relatively large is related to the timing of the 2008 report, which included large donations for the Annual meeting and did not include the meeting costs.

The 75th Annual Meeting of the Georgia Entomological Society was held April 6-8, at Lake Blackshear Resort and Golf Club located at Cordele. The Local Arrangements Committee consisted of Michael Toews, chair. The chair wishes to acknowledge that there was unanimous approval of all decisions made by the committee this year.

Highlights of the committee's work included:

- The first on-site visit of the venue occurred in late June 2010, meals and space requirements were evaluated in July, and the contract was finalized in early August.
