

Minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting of the Georgia Entomological Society

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes

April 13, 2022. Villas by the Sea, Jekyll Island GA

Attending: Mike Toews (Membership), Dan Suiter (Scholarship), Stan Diffie (Secretary-Treasurer), David Shapiro-Ilan (President-Elect), Nancy Hinkle (President), Ted Cottrell (Local Arrangements), and Wayne Gardner (JES).

General Comments (Nancy Hinkle) –Called the meeting to order and acknowledged this was the first in-person GES meeting since 2019 due to Covid. Nancy thanked everyone for the online Executive meeting in 2021 to keep business in order.

Program Committee (David Shapiro-Ilan) –Program updates will be distributed at the registration table. The program includes 19 student papers and 19 student posters. Also, 18 regular member papers and 6 regular member posters were accepted for the program. This fills the sessions totally. Mike Toews suggested the need to encourage poster submissions due to time constraints. Also, the breaks were shortened to accommodate the number of papers which reduces the amount of time members have to visit with poster authors.

Journal of Entomological Science Annual Report (Wayne Gardner)—In 2021, the JES published Volume 56 which contained a total of 583 pages. There were 88 manuscripts submitted with an acceptance rate of 53%. Only 20% of the articles were submitted by GES members and 74% were submitted by authors outside the U.S. The journal has an impact factor of 5. There were no photo salon pictures to use for the cover due to the cancellation of the in-person meetings the past two years. Wayne solicited pictures from known colleagues to use instead. The journal is currently on good financial footing because Wayne has time to secure money from authors. All page charges are up to date. Mike Toews raised a concern about the lag time from submission to publication (about 1 year). Wayne said some of that is to make sure there are enough articles for the next issue. Wayne is concerned that Susan Thornhill is tiring of her responsibilities as Business Manager. Moving to an online format may help alleviate some strain in addition to other benefits. Approximately 40% of the fees paid to Allen Press are due to hard copies. The Society may consider charging members based on their desire for hard copies or online distribution in the future. The journal has a very good relationship with BioOne and Allen Press. Wayne recommended to the Executive Committee that we explore and move to an online publication with an open access format.

Local Arrangements Report (Ted Cottrell) – Paper presentations and the luncheon will be in the same room. The buffet line will be set up in an adjoining room. Refreshments will be set up in the lobby for morning and afternoon breaks. Coffee and water will be provided by Villas and Ted purchased the food for the breaks. Lunch will be a BBQ buffet. Mark Abney brought the poster boards, but they will need to be set up tonight or early in the morning. Ted brought AV connectors to cover all options (hopefully).

Scholarship Report (Dan Suiter) – Only one Ph D application was received. Alex Orfinger will be awarded this scholarship. Three persons applied for the M.S. scholarship and Zia Williamson was selected as the winner.

Nominations Committee Report (Dan Suiter) – The committee asked Brett Blaauw and Ash Sial to run for President-Elect. Online information sheets were sent to all registrants and ballots will be distributed during the luncheon.

Membership Committee (Stan Diffie and Mike Toews)—Stan distributed a graph of membership totals for the past nine years. It showed a steady growth pattern with an average of approximately 268 members. Mike presented the names of recently deceased members or former members of the Society. A suggestion was made to consider changing the by-laws so members could stay on the rolls for five years before being dropped for delinquent payments.

Financial Report (Stan Diffie) – The current financial report for was presented (attached) to the committee. There was a net profit of \$6349 over the past two years due to the lack of a meeting. This year we have had \$3100 support generated from the corporate sponsors thanks to Dan Suiter and Phillip Roberts. The society is still in good shape financially with close to \$70,000 as of the meeting.

Site Selection (Jason Schmidt) – Jason was not able to attend the meeting and will give a report at the general business meeting on Friday.

New Business -- Mike Toews suggested combining the Public Relations and Membership committees. Also, we should utilize our Facebook page better, as well as other social media.

Final Business Meeting Minutes

April 15, 2022. Villas by the Sea, Jekyll Island, GA

Nancy Hinkle presided over the Final Business Meeting of the 84th annual GES meeting.

Nancy Hinkle recognized Stan Diffie to read the minutes of the last meeting. Will Hudson made a motion to dispense of the reading of the minutes and this was seconded by Jason Schmidt.

Secretary/Treasurers Report (Stan Diffie) – The financial report covering activity from 2019 through 2021 was distributed to attendees and discussed. Stan Diffie reported an operating profit of \$1918.23 in 2019, the Lake Blackshear meeting. Due to early registration in anticipation of a 2020 meeting, the Society operated with a surplus of \$6349 during the past two years. As of April 1, 2022, the Society had \$67,000 in reserves which includes a CD containing \$41, 535 (See below).

Necrology Report (Mike Toews)—Mike read the names of members/former members who passed away since the last meeting. These included: Alton Sparks, Amy Javier, Maxcy Nolan, Carroll Yonce, Marianne Shockley, Dick Chalfant, John Young, Bob Evans, Butch Hodges

Audit Report (Phillip Roberts) – Phillip reported that the books of the Society were found to be in good order. The report is attached.

Journal of Entomological Science (Wayne Gardner) -- Volume 56 was published in 2021 in four quarterly issues with a total of 583 pages, 36 scientific articles, and 20 scientific notes. During 2021, 88 manuscripts were submitted and 53% were accepted. Only 20% were submitted by GES members and 74% were submitted by authors outside the U.S. The journal is on solid financial foundation with an account balance of \$35,575.74 on March 24, 2022. This has been increased from an all-time low of \$8,690 in 2017.

The journal enjoys a strong connection with BioOne and our publisher, Allen Press. We also have a successful online presence. Increasingly, scientific journals are moving to online publishing only. Wayne recommended that we explore and move to an online publication that releases accepted manuscripts in a continuous manner and moving away from an issue-based publication.

Nominations Committee (Dan Suiter) – Brett Blaauw and Ash Sial agreed to run for President-Elect. Ballots were distributed during the luncheon and results will be announced later in the business meeting. Stan Diffie's term as Secretary/Treasurer has ended. David Shapiro-Ilan made a motion for Stan to continue for another term; Mike Toews seconded. A voice vote carried the motion.

Insect Survey (Mark Abney) – Mark reported on the draft of the most recent Arthropod Report. Upon completion, the report will be placed on the society's webpage.

Fun Run (Jason Schmidt) – Several people participated in the Fun Run on the island. The course was not a typical 5K run as part of the course ran along the coast through the Driftwood Beach area and along well-worn trails. The tide was in during the run which made it necessary to hurdle the driftwood on the course. Winners included: Amos Kaldor at 32:01 for the men, Sarah Rezende at 42:22 for the women, and Scott Croxton at 34:53 for the industry reps.

Fishing Tournament (Will Hudson) – New guidelines were distributed prior to the competition, and these were consulted and ruled on throughout the day(s). Several entries were disqualified by the committee due to speciation, improper use of measuring devices, and submission deadlines. After the carnage was determined, Arash Kheirodin was awarded the fish pillow for having a fish measuring somewhere around 13.5 inches.

Silent Auction (Linda Smyth) – Linda thanked everyone for a successful auction this year. She reported over \$300 had been raised from 43 stations. A live auction of two historical entomological books was conducted during the business meeting and Jason Schmidt won the bidding at \$55. Prizes were awarded to the individual who bid the highest on an item, the person(s) who paid the least for items, and the person who bid on the most items which drove up the bids on those items.

Resolutions (Shimat Joseph) – Shimat moved to not read the resolutions but just have them included in the minutes on the website (attached).

Snapp Award – The Snapp Award, for best presentation by a regular member, was presented to Mike Toews for his presentation of “A Systems Approach to Improving Cotton Production and Profitability”.

Site Selection (Jason Schmidt) –The options for the 2023 meeting included Jekyll Island, Athens, the UGA Bamboo Farm, Unicoi State Park, Gwinnett Gardens, and Tifton. Pros and cons of each venue were discussed. A hand vote was taken, and the overwhelming choice was Unicoi or a location in proximity (Amicalola Falls, Blairsville) dependent on dates and costs. Members reminded Jason to consider SEB and Lund Week as possible conflicts.

Members asked about a joint meeting in 2025 when Scott Croxton is president of the Florida Ent Soc. Scott will address this with the Florida Ent Soc. In this case, a North Florida or South Georgia coastal area may be the best site in 2025. David Shapiro-Ilan made a motion to use the vote as a ranking for Jason to work through. Shimat Joseph seconded the motion.

Conclusion (Nancy Hinkle) – Nancy took time to thank several people who were instrumental in the success of the meeting. These included Ted Cottrell (local arrangements), the session moderators, the AV assistants, Mark Abney for delivery of the poster boards, Dan Suiter and Phillip Roberts for soliciting industry donations, industry repos for their support, and Stan Diffie for his tireless work in many aspects of the meeting and throughout the year.

Nancy Hinkle announced that both candidates for President-elect were well-deserving, and after tabulating the ballots, it was determined that Brett Blaauw was the winner.

Nancy Hinkle passed the President's gavel to David Shapiro-Ilan.

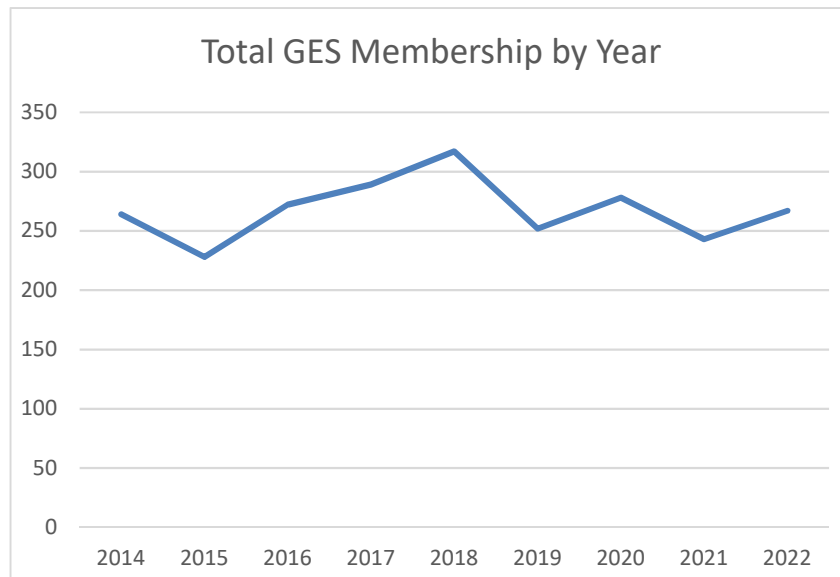
David Shapiro-Ilan presented Nancy Hinkle a plaque in gratitude for her service as GES President for the past 3 years.

2021 ANNUAL REPORT

Volume 56 of the *Journal of Entomological Science* was published online and in print in 4 quarterly issues with a total of 583 pages, 36 scientific articles, and 20 scientific notes. For the 56 manuscripts published in the volume, the average time from receipt of the manuscript to action taken on acceptance was 34 days (See Table 1 for summary data by volume from 2006 through 2021). Cover photos for each of the issues were selected from the 2019 GES Photo Salon and solicited from photographers (as no annual meetings with the GES Photo Salon were convened in 2020 and 2021). Those photos were provided by Tracie Jenkins (nos. 1, 2), John Lilly (no. 3), and Dana Lilly (no. 4).

During 2021, 88 manuscripts were submitted for consideration for publication in the *Journal*. The acceptance rate for those submissions was 53.4%. Of those submitted, only 20% were submitted by GES members, while 74% were submitted by authors affiliated with non-U.S. institutions. A summary by year of total submissions, acceptance rates, and the account balances and net incomes for years 2006 through 2021 is shown in Table 2.

Susan Thornhill, Business Manager, reported a balance of \$35,575.74 in the *Journal* checking account at Regions Bank (Griffin, GA) as of 24 March 2022. The report of deposits, disbursements, and balances for the fiscal year is in Table 3.

Kudos to Rebecca Griffin of the University of Georgia and her co-authors for their paper being recognized as 1 of 36 papers listed in the April 2022 Top and Trending articles published in BioOne journals. The paper entitled, "Knowledge Gleaned from the First Great Georgia Pollinator Census," appeared in the first issue of volume 57 in January 2022.

Membership and Computer Resources

The committee is composed of members Michael Toews, David Riley, and Stan Diffie.

GES membership is stable between 250 and 300 members, despite a large turnover in student members. Although there is nearly complete turnover in the students about every three years, new students replace the old ones. At present, approximately 60% of the membership are classified as “regular members, 5% as “retired/emeritus/fellows” and 35% as student members.

Regarding the GES webpage, we continue to be hosted on the UGA CAES website at <https://site.caes.uga.edu/ges/>. The website generally receives about 500 hits a month from 200 unique visitors. Website visitors use a desktop computer by a 4 to 1 margin over mobile phones. There are very few visits from a tablet. Country of origin for website visitors in 2021 was 83% US, 3.4% India, 1.7% China. We also receive a handful of hits every year from Europe and South America.
