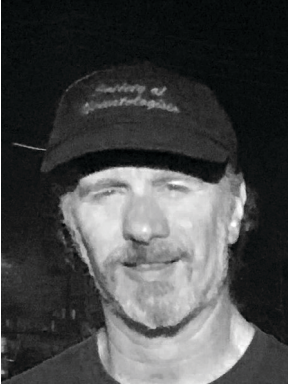

His career path includes a B.S. in Biology, University of Michigan; Peace-Corps Volunteer, Niger; M.S. in Entomology, Louisiana State University; Ph.D. in Entomology, Iowa State University; Fulbright Post-doctoral Scholar, Volcani Center, Israel; Research Insect Pathologist, IBCS, Inc.; Assistant in Entomology, University of Florida; joined USDA-ARS in 1999. Dr. Shapiro-Ilan's research focuses on invertebrate pathology and microbial control targeting pecan and peach as well as other cropping systems. Shapiro-Ilan has published > 225 peer-reviewed journal articles, 27 book chapters, co-edited 6 books and is inventor on 8 patents. Selected awards include Fellow of the Entomological Society of America, Fellow of the Society of Nematologists, Excellence in IPM (SEB-ESA) and > \$22 million as PI/co-PI on competitive grants. He currently serves as Editor-in-Chief for the Journal of Invertebrate Pathology.

**FOUNDERS HONOREE •**

***Nancy Hinkle***

Dr. Nancy C. Hinkle is the University of Georgia's Veterinary Entomologist, concerned with ectoparasites of vertebrate animals including cattle, poultry, horses, sheep, goats, pets, and wildlife. She is particularly involved with economically significant arthropods in animal agriculture, with a focus on flies, poultry beetles, and ectoparasitic mites.

Nancy grew up on a cow-calf operation 20 miles from Auburn, AL. She was valedictorian of her Dadeville High School class and a National Merit Scholar. Her parents owned and operated a manufacturing plant where she worked summers and holidays, convincing her that the business world was not for her. Once she found out that there was a profession called entomology and that one could make a living at it, her career path was set.

After receiving her B.S. (Biology) and M.S. (studying with Gary Mullen in Medical Entomology) degrees from Auburn University, Nancy worked at the Coastal Plain Experiment Station in Tifton for four years, and then pursued her PhD at the University of Florida (in Phil Koehler's program). While a student at UF, she worked as a technician at the USDA's Insects Affecting Man & Animals Laboratory, convincing her that research on animal pests was what she wanted to devote her career to. Upon completion of her PhD, she was hired by the University of California, Riverside, as the Extension Veterinary Entomologist for California. After nine years there she was hired by UGA and joined the faculty in Athens in 2001.

Along with her graduate students and collaborators, Nancy has continued her work on house flies on dairies, darkling beetles in broiler houses, northern fowl mites on chickens, and horn flies on cattle. And yes, she still takes the 'invisible bugs' calls.

She has served as President of the Southeastern Branch of ESA, of ESA's Medical, Urban, and Veterinary Entomology section (when it was called Section D), for the Society for Vector Ecology, and for the Georgia Entomological Society. She has been recognized with Lifetime Achievement Awards from the Southern IPM Center and the Livestock Insect Workers Conference.

The first GES meeting Nancy attended was as a graduate student, presenting on cattle ear tags for horn fly control at the 1981 meeting in Tifton. As GES president (2020-2022), she was particularly pleased to preside over the 2022 GES meeting 41 years later.



## FOUNDERS LECTURER •

### Wayne Gardner

Wayne Gardner is Professor Emeritus with the University of Georgia. He joined the UGA faculty of the Department of Entomology as part of the Griffin Campus unit in January 1979. Wayne advanced through the professorial ranks conducting research in various cropping systems against a diversity of insect pests. He was especially interested in the development of microbial agents for the biological control of several target pest species including the pecan weevil, lepidopteran larvae, various aphids, and the kudzu bug. He also served in several administrative roles including Interim Department Head (1996-1997), Director of the Georgia Center for Urban Agriculture (1998-2002), and Director of the UGA Research and Education Garden (1998-2019). Wayne retired from the University in 2019.



Dr. Gardner joined the Georgia Entomological Society as a student member in 1975 and has since been an active member of the Society serving on various committees and as President in 2004-2005. He was honored as a GES Fellow in 2006 and was the Founders Honoree in 2013. Wayne currently serves as Editor of the Journal of Entomological Science, a position he has held since 1993. Prior to that, he served as Business Manager for the Journal from 1988 to 1993.

Wayne remains busy in retirement with editorial duties, coaching elite competitive youth soccer, volunteering with rescue dogs, and enjoying family and friends.
