

Minutes of the 2024 Annual Meeting of the Georgia Entomological Society

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes

April 3, 2024. Villas by the Sea, Jekyll Island GA

Attending: Brett Blaauw (President), Ash Sial (President-elect), Stan Diffie (Secretary-Treasurer), David Shapiro-Ilan (Past President), Nancy Hinkle (Historian), Apurba Barman and Shimat Joseph (Local Arrangements), Erich Schoeller (Site Selection), Ed Mondor (Scholarship), and Wayne Gardner (JES).

General Comments (Brett Blaauw) –Called the meeting to order and handed out agendas for the meeting to everyone present. Brett thanked everyone for the work they had done to make the meeting a success.

Local Arrangements Report (Apurba Barman and Shimat Joseph) – Mark Abney brought the poster boards from Tifton, and these would be set up first thing in Thursday morning so participants could attach their posters. Apurba and Shimat purchased break supplies at Sam’s Club, and these will be available Thursday morning and afternoon, as well as Friday morning. They bought cookies, croissants, granola bars, fruit, and other items. They brought coffee pots and will make coffee for the participants throughout the day. Apurba brought the computer and Villas by the Sea provided the projector, speakers, and microphone. It was noted that one paper will be via Zoom due to other obligations the speaker had. Paper presentations and the luncheon will be in the same room. The buffet line will be set up the lobby. Refreshments will be set up in the lobby for morning and afternoon breaks. Lunch will feature chicken and fish.

Program Committee (Ash Sial) –Brett volunteered to format the program. The program includes 19 student papers and 12 student posters. Also, 18 regular member papers and 6 regular member posters were accepted for the program. This fills the sessions Thursday afternoon and Friday morning. One student had to drop a paper presentation but another applied late but was allowed to fill the vacated spot. The Founder Lecture will honor David Riley and will be given by Stormy Sparks. This year a Fellow will be honored (Mike Strand) and a lecture will be delivered by Galen Burke. Also, Joe LaForest will present Elmer Gray with a Southern IPM Communicator award.

It was suggested that a more concerted effort be made to reach out to other universities/colleges in the state to encourage student participation. Kennesaw State, University of North Georgia, and Valdosta State have participated in the past.

The physical programs did not arrive on time and may or may not be available for the meeting.

Registrations (Stan Diffie)—Stan distributed graphs of meeting registration for the past 12 years. These included total registrations and registrations by category (regular members, students, etc). Apurba asked if students would come if the meeting was held on the weekends. Responses suggested no

because some students work on the weekends and hotels/resorts would be more expensive on the weekends. Nancy said the size of the program is good as it is and if the meeting gets much bigger, we may have to go to concurrent sessions. Ash suggested we encourage papers go to posters if we get too many submissions. Erich suggested 'lightening talks' of 5 minutes if we need to squeeze in more talks. Apurba said he thought the students might think this to be a fun alternative.

Site Selection (Erich Scholler and Apurba Barman)—Erich suggested Stone Mountain Evergreen Resort. He did not have any details but wondered if the group would have an interest in this venue. A return to Unicoi was also suggested. The last joint meeting with South Carolina was held in 2018, so the possibility of another joint meeting was discussed. It will be South Carolin's turn to host it, so it may be in the Fall and in South Carolina.

Awards/Recognition (Brett Blauw)—This will be the first year since 2018 that someone will be recognized as a Fellow. Mike Strand was selected as the recipient of this honor. David Riley was selected as this year's Founder's award recipient.

Scholarship Report (Ed Mondor) – Two people applied for the M.S. scholarship and 4 applied for the Ph.D scholarship. The Ph.D competition was good. The M.S. competition had a winner declared because of a technicality. It was suggested and discussed to re-write the by-laws to make the instructions clearer. This is not the first year the committee has run into problems. Renee Nowicki will be awarded the M.S. scholarship and Sudeep Pandey was selected as the winner of the Ph.D scholarship.

Journal of Entomological Science Annual Report (Wayne Gardner)—In 2023, the JES published Volume 58 which contained a total of 483 pages. Volume 20 (1985) through the current volume can be found on the website. Online articles are all open access now. The early online application platform allows for articles to be accepted, proofed, and paid in a timelier fashion. In 2023, 113 papers were submitted with a 51% acceptance rate. Forty papers can be found in Volume 58, and these had a 61 day average turnaround time. This past year had the biggest return in journal history with \$16, 500; however future printing costs will cut into that profit. BioOne continues to be a nice infusion source of revenue. A question was raised as to why U.S. authors are not contributing, and the current impact factor was the only viable answer given to this question. The suggestion was made to have a special issue composed of symposium papers. The drawback is whether symposium authors would contribute their papers to the journal. A comment was made that a lot of younger authors want to publish in more broadfield journals instead of specific discipline journals. The bottom line is the journal is doing well. Wayne reminded the committee that he has been doing this a long time and a replacement needs to be a priority for the society.

Operating Guidelines (Ed Mondor)—Ed sent his latest version to Brett. He stressed that it has been 16 years since the last version was adopted and an update needs to be made and adopted.

Nominations Committee Report (Brett Blaauw) – The committee asked Scott Croxton and Shimat Joseph to run for President-Elect. Online information sheets were sent to all registrants and ballots will be distributed during the luncheon.

Financial Report (Stan Diffie) – Stan passed out copies of the financial report and graphs showing the trend in the society’s finances. The society maintains \$55,000 to \$60, 000 in assets. The current financial situation posed the question of whether we should increase the amount given to Wayne each year. Another proposal was raised as to whether the journal could increase page charges to supplement the editor’s and the business manager’s payment. Other options were entertained but no final agreement was reached.

Necrology—Jerry Payne, James Hunter Jr., and Bill Blasingame were recognized as former members who passed away in 2023.

Final Business Meeting Minutes

April 5, 2024. Villas by the Sea, Jekyll Island, GA

Brett Blaauw presided over the Final Business Meeting of the 86th annual GES meeting. He thanked the local arrangements committee, Apurba Barman and Shimat Joseph, for their work in putting the meeting together. He also thanked the society for their patience on Thursday during the schedule adjustments throughout the day.

Brett Blaauw recognized Stan Diffie to read the minutes of the last meeting. Mark Abney made a motion to dispense of the reading of the minutes and this was seconded by Mike Toews.

Secretary/Treasurers Report (Stan Diffie) – Stan reported a final tally of 95 registrants for the 2024 annual meeting. The financial report covering activity from 2023 was distributed to attendees and discussed. Stan Diffie reported an operating budget of \$63,000 at present but this does not include expenses related to the 2024 meeting. The society has been maintaining an account of \$55,000 to \$60,000 the past few years. (See below).

Necrology Report (Ted Cottrell)—Ted presented short bios on James Hunter, Jr and William (Bill) Blasingame. He provided a more in-depth bio for Jerry Payne. Bill and Jerry were both former presidents of the society.

Audit Report (Stormy Sparks) – Stormy reported that he and Phillip Roberts audited the books and records of the society and everything was found to be in good order. (The report is attached).

Journal of Entomological Science (Wayne Gardner) -- Volume 58 was published in 2023 in four quarterly issues with a total of 483 pages. There were 113 manuscripts submitted with a 51% acceptance rate. (The complete report is attached).

Nominations Committee (Dan Suiter) – Scott Croxton and Shimat Joseph agreed to run for President-Elect. Ballots were distributed during the Friday morning session and Shimat Joseph received the most votes and will serve as President-elect in 2024-2025.

Insect Survey (Mark Abney) – Mark described the survey and its purpose for new faculty and others in attendance. He encouraged everyone to compile their reports and send them to him as soon as possible. Mark mentioned that this serves as good historical data and he uses it to compare insect numbers from different years. Upon completion, the report will be placed on the society's webpage.

Fun Run – The Fun Run was cancelled this year due to inclement weather.

Fishing Tournament (Will Hudson) – Will noted that the fishing participants braved the weather from noon until 5:00 pm and did not understand why the Fun Run was cancelled. He then displayed the trophy that is kept by the winner until the next tournament. After showing the current rules and

explaining how they continue to evolve, Will showed pictures of each participant's largest fish which was considered their entry into the competition. The competition was close for a while (after ruling against the use of feet as a measuring stick) until Dan Suiter's shark was measured. Dan took the trophy home (we hope).

Silent Auction (Linda Smyth) – Linda thanked everyone for a successful auction this year. She said the auction would remain open for a few minutes after the meeting and hoped to reach the \$650 mark.

Resolutions (Brett Blaauw) – Brett read the 2024 Annual Meeting Resolutions. (The resolutions are attached).

Snapp Award – The Snapp Award, for best presentation by a regular member, was presented to Brett Blaauw for his presentation of "Exploiting sex pheromones to effectively manage San Jose scale in Georgia peach production". The committee complimented him on his ability to incorporate the quote from Fritz Haber on the use of hydrocyanic gas in his talk.

Student Awards (Stan Diffie)—Stan read the names of the winners from each of the papers and poster sessions. (See attached list).

Site Selection (Erich Scholler and Apurba Barman) –The options for the 2025 meeting included UGA Coastal Botanical Gardens in Savannah, Evergreen Resort at Stone Mountain, and Unicoi State Park. Pros and cons of each venue were discussed. A hand vote was taken, and the overwhelming choice was Unicoi or a location in proximity (Amicalola Falls) dependent on dates and costs. Brett offered a joint meeting with the South Carolina Entomological Society with them hosting this time. After discussion, it was decided this should be planned a couple of years in advance—possible 2026.

Conclusion (Nancy Hinkle) – Nancy took time to thank several people who were instrumental in the success of the meeting. These included Ted Cottrell (local arrangements), the session moderators, the AV assistants, Mark Abney for delivery of the poster boards, Dan Suiter and Phillip Roberts for soliciting industry donations, industry repos for their support, and Stan Diffie for his tireless work in many aspects of the meeting and throughout the year.

Brett Blaauw passed the President's gavel to Ash Sial.

Ash Sial presented Brett Blaauw a plaque in gratitude for his service as GES President during 2023-2024.

Ash Sial dismissed the meeting.

2024 Report of the GES Audit Committee

Stan Diffie provided monthly bank statements, PayPal statements, CD statements and receipts for review of financial activities of GES from January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023.

We completed reviewing these materials on March 28, 2024.

In comparison of account information to the financial report, the beginning and ending balances for the Checking, PayPal and CD are accurately reflected in the report. These materials appear consistent with proper financial management of the Society.

All significant disbursements of funds were accompanied by appropriate receipts. All movement of funds from PayPal are reflected in deposits into the GES checking account.

More than \$1,000 was paid to the Journal. Mr. Diffie explained that these are page charge funds collected through PayPal on behalf of the Journal and are simply passed through the GES account as a service to the Journal.

2023 ANNUAL REPORT

Volume 58 of the *Journal of Entomological Science* was published online and in print in 4 quarterly issues with a total of 483 pages, 34 scientific articles, 5 scientific notes, and 1 erratum. For the 40 manuscripts published in the volume, the average time from receipt of the manuscript to action taken on acceptance was 61 days (See Table 1 for summary data by volume from 2010 through 2023). Cover photos for each of the issues were provided by Jason Chen of Emory University (no. 1), Francis Mullan of Kennesaw State University (no. 2), Tracie Jenkins of Macon, GA (no. 3), and Joshua Gibson of Georgia Southern University (no. 4).

During 2023, 113 manuscripts were submitted for consideration for publication in the *Journal*. The acceptance rate for those submissions was 51%. Of those submitted, 13 (12%) were submitted by GES members, 3 (2%) were submitted by U.S.-based non-GES member authors, and 97 (86%) were submitted by authors affiliated with non-U.S. institutions [India (38), China (21), Mexico (10), Pakistan (6), Egypt (4), and 20 from 13 other countries]. A summary by year of total submissions, acceptance rates, and the account balances and net incomes for years 2010 through 2023 is shown in Table 2.

Susan Thornhill, Business Manager, reported a balance of \$54,118.24 in the Journal checking account at Regions Bank (Griffin, GA) as of 31 March 2024. Deposits, disbursements, and balances for the year are listed in Table 3.

This year, Early Online Publication was added to our online offering. These articles can be accessed on the site under Available Issues > Online Early Articles. Requisites for placement in the listing are acceptance of the manuscript, final approval of the proof, and payment of the publication costs for the paper. Articles are removed and placed in printed issues as scheduled. As reported last year, the Journal remains open access for all those visiting our site at gaentsoc.org as well as through the link <https://bioone.org/journals/journal-of-entomological-science/issues> on the BioOne site.

Working with our relatively new publishing partners is operating smoothly. KnowledgeWorks Global Ltd. (KLG) provides content services such as editorial, peer review, and online hosting for journals. The Sheridan Pennsylvania facility prints and mails our printed issues. A difference we noted in this arrangement is receipt of invoices from the two entities for their respective services.
